## What is a Community Foundation?

A community foundation is a collection of separate funds established by individuals, organizations and corporations – a window to the community – to enhance the quality of life in a local area. These funds are pooled and invested by a board of directors made up of community leaders, and the income is distributed in the form of grants. The first community foundation began in 1914 in Cleveland. There are now over 550 community foundations nationwide, controlling aggregate assets worth over \$25 billion. Community foundations are the fastest growing form of philanthropy in America today and often are in the vanguard of charitable giving.

# What is the

## Northern Virginia Community Foundation?

We are a public charity established in 1978 by the late Maynard DeWitt and others to meet a wide variety of social, educational, cultural and other charitable needs throughout Northern Virginia. We do so through the distribution of income (and in some cases principal) from endowment funds established by our donors. The Northern Virginia Community Foundation is fully tax-exempt under Sections 501(c)(3) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi) of the Internal Revenue Code.

# Message to the Community



We are pleased to present the 1999-2000 Northern Virginia Community Foundation (NVCF) Annual Report. Our tag line is “Window to the Community” because through our Board, staff, donors and volunteers, the Foundation is able to see and define community needs and administer programs, grants and scholarships that offer solutions.

The Foundation is a 501(C)(3) public charity that is a permanent community endowment. NVCF, through the generosity of its donors, supports arts, education, health, youth and community improvement programs. Gifts large and small make a difference and are contributed by individual, corporate and organizational donors. The growing support for NVCF is a testament to the charitable spirit of our community and the will to improve support services for our neediest neighbors.

By working with the Foundation, donors are able to make lasting gifts that may fund charitable programs for generations to come. Funds are pooled for investment purposes and

the income and sometimes principal is distributed in the form of grants and scholarships. For as little as \$5,000 a donor may establish a named fund to support particular charitable interests. The Foundation handles the administrative end of making gifts including due diligence, reporting, distribution, accounting and investments. In addition to the ease and flexibility donors experience in their partnership with the Foundation, donors find that there are many tax and estate planning benefits tied to gifts to public charities. Because of these advantages, giving through a community foundation is the fastest growing form of philanthropy in the country.

The Annual Report highlights several of our programs and grant recipients and provides information on making a contribution or establishing a named fund through the Foundation. Please take a moment to look through our window to the community and think about how you too can partner with us to make a difference.



# Why Make

## *Charitable Gifts through the Northern Virginia Community Foundation?*

Creating a named fund at the Community Foundation is an efficient vehicle for donors wishing to make a lasting charitable contribution. With a minimum gift of \$5,000, a donor may establish a named fund that, under the guidance of the NVCF Investment Committee, will grow over time. Many donors with intentions of making lasting philanthropic gifts have found that working through a community foundation is more advantageous than creating a private foundation. Setting up a private foundation is an onerous task that can be expensive and time-consuming. Significant rules and regulations apply to all private foundations and the tax deduction is limited to thirty percent (30%) of adjusted gross income as opposed to fifty percent (50%) for gifts made to public charities.

The Community Foundation can establish a fund for almost any donor with charitable intentions. It is a simple, cost-effective way to give a gift to the community for generations to come.

# The Jonathan David Hussey Memorial Fund

Jonathan David Hussey found meaning in his life by helping others find ways to improve their own lives and surroundings - first through his work, and later when his illness wore him down - through his desire to establish a fund to help people with AIDS.

Jon was the second of four sons in a military family who graduated from Hammond High School in Alexandria, Middlebury College and earned a masters degree from the University of Virginia.

He served four years in the US Army and then began a career in city planning. Jon is remembered by his colleague, James Morales, as a man of "intelligence and impeccable judgement, coupled with a wry sense of humor and special view of the world that made him not only a valuable colleague, but a friend as

well. As an environmental planner and a neighborhood planner for the Mission and Bernal Heights Districts in San Francisco, Jon demonstrated his extraordinary ability to focus on the heart of issues. His special sensitivity to the concerns among diverse groups enabled him to shape solutions that balanced all interests. These skills and his kindness to others earned him respect from community activists, residents and colleagues". Jon's thoughtfulness, decency and goodwill toward others defined his character and will live always in the hearts of those who loved him.

The Jonathan David Hussey Memorial Fund was established at the Foundation to fulfill Jon's wish to support AIDS patients. Each year income from the fund is distributed in the form of grants to organizations that provide direct service to AIDS patients.

# Types of Funds

---

Community Foundations provide flexible and cost effective alternatives to charitable trusts and private foundations. Gifts can be added to existing funds or a donor can establish a specialized named fund.

#### Here are some examples:

Many donors choose to make Unrestricted Gifts which allow the Grants Review committee and the Board of Directors of the Community Foundation the flexibility to meet the ever changing needs of the community.

**Field of Interest Funds** provide the opportunity for individuals or groups of donors with similar charitable interests, to support broad concerns such as Education, Youth, the Arts or Health.

Donors wishing to support one or more charitable organizations establish **Designated Funds**. Annually, income from these funds is distributed to named organizations with the approval of the NVCF Board.

**Advised Funds** offer the donor an opportunity to annually recommend grant recipients to

receive the income from the fund. As donor interests change, the organizations they ask to support may also change.

Through **Organization Funds**, charitable agencies establish endowments for operational, program or capital support.

**Donor Advised Gift Funds** are non-endowed funds. Donors may request that the NVCF Board consider gifts from the principal to support charities.

Donors who wish to create specific scholarship programs establish **Scholarship Funds**. Funds may support existing scholarship programs or the donor may set up an independent program administered by the Foundation.

**The Community Fund** is a pooled fund for donors who wish to make one-time or multi-year gifts to a fund that is administered by the NVCF Board. Each year income from the fund is used to support grant requests made by organizations benefiting Northern Virginians.

# The PRC

Corporate Scholarship Fund



Litton PRC, a leading provider of scientific, engineering and information technology-based solutions for public sector clients, has established a scholarship fund at the Northern Virginia Community Foundation for the benefit of their employees. Litton PRC has over 150 offices nationwide and is headquartered in Woodland Hills, California.

Any eligible dependent child of a Litton PRC employee may apply for one of the eight college scholarships awarded annually by Litton PRC and administered by the Northern Virginia Community Foundation.

The Northern Virginia Community Foundation accepts and reviews the applications for completeness and an independent selection committee from local Universities determines the recipients. Eight college scholarships are awarded annually by Litton PRC and each student selected will receive up to \$4,000, issued in \$1,000 increments (\$500 per semester) for a maximum of four years

- Four \$4,000 scholarships are awarded based on Academic Achievement
- Three \$4,000 scholarships are awarded based on Financial Need and Academic Achievement

- One \$4,000 scholarship is awarded to a student with a Learning Disability
- Each student must remain in good academic standings at the college or university they attend, in order to maintain their scholarship. The Northern Virginia Community Foundation is proud to work with Litton PRC to help reward students for their successes.

### Partnership with GMU& NVCC

The Northern Virginia Community Foundation has had the pleasure of partnering with academic advisors at George Mason University and Northern Virginia Community College for several years. Both GMU and NVCC have provided independent selection committees to the Northern Virginia Community Foundation for our scholarship programs. In the spring and early summer of each year, these committees take on the arduous task of awarding the recipients of the Jack E. Aalseth Scholarship Fund, the Booz\*Allen Vision Scholarship Fund, the PRC Corporate Scholarship Fund, the Ogden Corporate Scholarship Fund, and the Vance International Scholarship.

# Ways to Give

---

## **Cash Gifts**

This is the simplest and most convenient way to participate in the work of the Foundation. Your cash gifts qualify for maximum deductibility for income tax purposes.

## **Appreciated Property**

Your gift of appreciated securities and real property to the Foundation may provide important tax advantages. The full fair market value of such gifts is deductible as a charitable contribution subject to a percentage of income limitations and alternative minimum tax rules.

## **Bequests**

You can name the Foundation in a will as: the residuary beneficiary of the state; the recipient of a stated sum or contingent bequest; or the ultimate recipient of the assets of a charitable remainder trust. All such bequests are deductible for estate and inheritance tax purposes.

## **Charitable Remainder and Annuity Trust**

You can name the Northern Virginia Community Foundation as the ultimate beneficiary of a charitable remainder unitrust or an annuity trust. When the life income interests are terminated, the assets of the gifts will be distributed to the Foundation for use as you direct in the trust instrument.

## **Charitable Lead Trust**

When you name the Northern Virginia Community Foundation as the initial beneficiary of a charitable lead trust, you specify when the Foundation's interest will terminate. The trust then continues for the benefit of, or terminates in favor of one or more specified individuals. There is usually a significant estate tax benefit with this plan.

## **Life Insurance**

If you name the Foundation as the owner and beneficiary of an existing or new life insurance policy, you receive an immediate tax deduction equal approximately to the cash surrender value of the policy. All premium payments you make thereafter are also deductible.

## **Private Foundations**

As a party to a private foundation, you may find it useful to make a direct gift from that foundation or transfer some or all of its assets to the Northern Virginia Community Foundation. This can be done by establishing a significant fund with the Northern Virginia Community Foundation that sustains the name and purposes of the transferring foundation. In the case of a 509(a)(3) supporting organization, the Foundation continues to have its own Board of Trustees.

# Grant Recipient *Spotlight*

The Fairfax Youth Partnership, Inc. is a comprehensive effort bringing the entire Fairfax County community together to focus on youth-related violence. The Partnership collaborates with government, business, community and non-profits to find ways to reduce youth violence and address related issues.

In 2000, the Northern Virginia Community Foundation received a grant from the Coalition of Community Foundations for Youth to fund a youth mapping project. NVCF used the money to fund a project sponsored and managed by the Partnership.

Students participating in the project completed a two-day training session provided by the Center for Youth

Development and Policy Research. Over 20 young people took part and walked door-to-door in Annandale, Virginia surveying businesses and organizations on the services, resources and opportunities they offer youth and families. The data collected in the mapping project will provide information on youth resources that are currently available in Annandale, what can be done to improve these existing resources, and what may be missing. The data was entered by the youth mappers into various database programs and will be accessible on the Internet. The Annandale Community Coalition, Fairfax County Teen Centers, Safe and Drug-Free Schools also supported this project.

# Benefits

## Of Being a Donor

Giving to the Northern Virginia Community Foundation means a donor's funds become part of a permanent legacy to the community. Donors also have the assurance that their funds are managed efficiently, effectively and thoughtfully to best meet the needs of the community's future.

Established to encourage philanthropy, the foundation's basic appeal lies in our flexibility, both in the types of gifts we can accept and the types of programs we can support. Many donors choose the Foundation because they like the convenience of "one-stop" giving.

### **Choice**

The donor may determine the purpose for which gifts are to be used, or may entrust that decision to the Board of Directors.

### **Simplicity**

The procedure for establishing a fund is simple and straightforward.

### **Flexibility**

Donors can realize nearly any charitable intent by choosing from among the variety of fund types offered by the Foundation. These funds may be tailored to meet specific needs and interests.

### **Giving Options**

Nearly any asset of value can be considered for a contribution. Contributions can be made during the donor's lifetime and/or through deferred gifts and bequests.

### **Tax Benefits**

Gifts during a donor's lifetime or by bequest are accorded the maximum tax advantage allowed.

### **Permanence**

Gifts will live for generations to come, because the Foundation generally spends only the income, not the principal of the contribution.

### **Professional Management**

Investment management of funds is handled by professional money managers retained by the Foundation. Investment strategies match the specific requirements of each fund and are implemented in accordance with the policy guidelines adopted by the Board of Directors. The Investment Committee of the Foundation reviews the investment performance of all funds on a regular basis. The assets of smaller funds are pooled for investment purposes, to ensure that the portfolios are well diversified to reduce risk. The primary investment target of the Foundation is to earn an average annual total rate of return on endowment assets of at least 5.0% greater than the rate of inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index. It is a fundamental tenet of the Foundation that endowment assets must be adequately diversified in order to reduce the risk associated with undue exposure to any single economic or industry sector or individual security. The following allocations are currently approved for Foundation investments:

#### **U.S. Common and Preferred Equities**

40% - 75%

#### **International Equities**

10% - 20%

#### **U.S. fixed Income Securities**

25% - 50%

#### **Cash Equivalents**

0% - 25%

# Funds of the Foundation



## ADVISED FUNDS

**Jack E. Aalseth Fund** - provides scholarships to students studying engineering or science.

**Appleby Fund** - provides direct grants and other forms of assistance for the charitable purpose of supporting elementary, secondary, undergraduate and graduate institutions.

**Atholton Donor Advised Gift Fund** - provides direct grants and other forms of assistance to benefit schools, churches, community outreach programs and healing organizations.

**Dan R. Bannister Fund** - provides financial assistance to charitable organizations in Northern Virginia.

**The Barbara Berman L.D. Resource Fund** - makes grants to assist organizations/projects designed specifically to assist Northern Virginia children who have learning disabilities, and other Northern Virginia education projects.

**The John Borden Memorial Fund** - provides financial assistance to charitable organizations in Northern Virginia.

**Grace Brettle Memorial Fund** - provides scholarship funds to women studying accounting at Northern Virginia Community College.

**Raymond F. and Jessica S. Burmester Endowment for Persons with Mental Retardation and Related Disabilities** - provides funds to organizations providing service to those with mental retardation and related disabilities.

**CharityWorks Donor Advised Gift Fund** - provides direct grants and other forms of assistance for the charitable purpose of supporting arts, youth, education, health and community improvement, providing benefit to those living and working in the Greater Washington area.

**James I. Chatman Advised Fund** - provides direct grants and other forms of assistance for charitable, educational, scientific and other qualifying purposes, and supports the Grandfathers Group Program.

**Children Together Fund** - supports the inclusion of preschool-age children with disabilities and their families in mainstream early childhood programs.

**Community Fund** - a pooled fund made up of small donor funds and direct funds from the Foundation, used by the Board of Directors to fund projects to benefit the Community.

**The Louise Hart Costello Memorial Advised Fund** - provides grants to address the problems facing aging (50 years and above) mildly to moderately retarded people and their caregivers in Manassas Park and neighboring jurisdictions.

**The Helen Denny Memorial Education Fund** - makes direct grants and other forms of assistance for educational, training and related purposes.

**The Cameron and Virginia Dye Scholarship Fund** - provides scholarships to Arlington County public high school graduates entering or attending college.

**Emergency Relief Fund** - provides direct grants and other forms of assistance to needy individuals who have suffered significant personal and/or financial losses under circumstances requiring quick aid and warranting special consideration.

**The John D. Evans Fund** - supports activities in the areas of the arts, youth, education, health, and community improvement for the benefit of the citizens of Northern Virginia.

**Shy and Jean Greenspan Fund** - supports organizations providing care and benefit for children who are mentally and physically handicapped, individuals who are sight-impaired and for the welfare of animals.

**Herndon Dulles Chamber of Commerce Scholarship Advised Fund** - provides annual scholarship awards to deserving individuals pursuing a certificate or undergraduate degree in business or a technology-related program.

**John Franklin Hiller Memorial Advised Fund** - provides college scholarship awards to seniors at West Springfield High School who have demonstrated interest, skill and promise in the writing of poetry.

**The Horoschak Family Fund** - provides direct grants and other forms of assistance for the charitable purpose of supporting youth, education, health and community improvement, providing benefit to those living and working in Northern Virginia and elsewhere in the United States.

**Huntsman Family Advised Fund** - provides direct grants and other forms of assistance solely for the charitable purposes that support programs and activities primarily focused on youth, education, housing, and health needs.

**Harriet L. Hulings ESL Advised Fund** - to help defray tuition, board and other education related expenses for former English as a Second Language (ESL) students from Herndon High School.

**The Jonathan David Hussey Memorial Fund** - provides direct payments and grants to individuals and organizations to help alleviate the financial burdens of needy individuals who are afflicted with AIDS.



**The J Hamilton Lambert Advised Fund** - makes direct grants and other forms of assistance to worthy organizations in Northern Virginia.

**Kent Gardens School Curriculum Fund** - provides direct grants and other forms of assistance to implement an educational project at the Kent Gardens Elementary School.

**Thomas G. Jewell Fund** - benefits organizations in Loudoun County.

**Sharon and Joseph Lawrence Family Advised Memorial Fund** - provides direct and indirect benefit to those living and working in the communities of Northern Virginia, regardless of the location of the grantee organizations. The fund emphasizes education programs.

**Gene Legg Donor Advised Gift Fund** - provides grants for charitable uses and purposes benefiting Northern Virginians.

**Edwin and Helen Lynch Donor Advised Gift Fund** - provides direct grants and other forms of assistance to support youth, education, health, community improvement, providing benefit to those living and working in the communities of South Eastern Fairfax County.

**Medical Care for Children Partnership** - provides funds for the medical care of needy children in Fairfax County.

**Newcomer of Great Falls Donor Advised Gift Fund** - provides direct grants and other forms of assistance for the charitable purpose of supporting youth, education, health and community improvement, providing benefit to those living and working in the Washington Metropolitan Area.

**Northern Virginia Children's Fund** - supports the ACCA Day Care Center and other subsidized child care facilities located in Fairfax County.

**PRC III Educational Fund** - provides scholarships, direct grants, and other forms of assistance to worthy, full-time employees of ATI and PRC and their dependents.

**The Jessica Leigh Siwek Fund** - provides direct grants and other forms of assistance for the charitable purpose of supporting youth, education, health and community improvement, providing benefit to those living and working in Northern Virginia.

**Tech-Ed Student Motivation Fund** - provides small grants to students and teachers in technology and science courses.
